Unfortunately most of the winners were in fact elsewhere, there being only eleven members at the meeting. The low number probably resulted from the fact that the meeting had to be scheduled for a non-traditional evening due to the recent Special General Meeting.

The theme of the evening was "Bring your favourite chisel and tell us why."

Jez Rowe, Nico Swart and Drew von Bratt were ready and prepared to participate and whilst some of the content of their demos covered ground outside of the theme, all were entertaining and, what is really more important in the context of a Guild, informative. Jez had available several chucks and chucking systems which he spoke about and answered questions on, giving from his experience both the advantages and disadvantages involved. He also demo'd a hollowing tool designed by Roly Munroe from New Zealand which he recommended – the tool not the Country. Unfortunately the price (R3000) is such that many of us would have to give up Scotch, wine, beer, DSTv and other earthly pleasures for a good few years to pay for it - largely dependent on your individual rate of consumption.

Nico talked about special tools that he had made from Allen key shafts and demo'd their unique purposes.

He also later turned a wine glass shape which was quite an achievement given the shaft length (about 200mm) and final diameter (+/- 4 mm). Impressive for a "normal" (?) wood turner in terms of the delicate touch needed – doubly so for Nico using only one skew chisel, one good arm and one eye!

Drew demonstrated his favourite chisel – a ring gouge – and some members participated to get the feel of the tool and the technique.

All in all a good evening and spot on the objective of fellowship and the cross pollination of wood turning knowledge and skill.
